- Los Vaqueros Group Horse Campground can accommodate a group of up to 80 people and 45 horses. There is room for about 25 large vehicles/rigs with a maximum length of 50 feet. There is no extra room so please ride share when possible.
- Campers must clean out their own corrals; trailers are supplied for the manure. Dogs must be kept on leashes no longer than 6', in a tent or enclosed vehicle at night and are not allowed on trails.
- You must pick up after your dogs and horses!!!

Metal trays

Does anyone remember the TV show Mash?? Hawkeye Pierce and BJ Honeycutt, Frank Burns and Colonel Potter were some of the characters. In the show there were several Mess Hall scenes with characters waiting in the food line talking as they were served meals on the metal trays. The trays had 6 to 8 sections for different foods. VPR's trays are the same type and as old, World War II era.

The 1940-50 five-day Palomar Rides served all their meals on these trays and here is the reason why. The Palomar Ride staged from the Club House on Bobier



Street (Stater Brothers current location) riding all the way to the top of Palomar Mt. and camping at Bailey's Meadow. This ride was a lot of work requiring most of the members to participate in various jobs and leadership roles. Past President Bud Stewart assumed the position of Head Ride Cook. He planned all the meals and recruited young men for the many meal duties. Bud and Board members decided we needed sturdy trays for outdoor cooking. So, Bud was off to the military surplus store to buy used Navy/Marine Corp metal trays and utensils. Not sure if the trays were used on the first 1947 Palomar Ride or several years later, but they were used for many years on our famous Chuck Wagon. We used those trays for the 25, 50 and 100-mile Camp Pendleton Endurance Rides, which VPR contracted with Chaps & Britches Club to provide breakfast for these Endurance Rides. Soon we were using the trays for our yearly Wagon Wheel Camp-out and all other VPR Events. Unfortunately, the trays were getting dented and worn down with age. These trays were heavy and difficult to wash so they were no longer practical for group use. Nothing is more constant than change, so the trays are gone. For convenience sake and time saving we use paper plates, but the memories of trays with lots of food variety will always remain.
