OUR ROOTS GO DEEP by Judy Duncan

This year the Vista Palomar Riders, Incorporated celebrates our 75th year. The club has seen many changes over the years with a rich and varied history. Recently I had occasion to look back at the club's history and thought the members might like to know more about the club, it's past members and events.

Actually, our roots go back beyond those 75 years to the 1930's and the Palomar Riders of Escondido, active 1936-1945 the first riding club formed in San Diego County with property in Harmony Gove.

Our present club was first formed July 12, 1946 as the Vista Riders an un-incorporated non-profit with about 50 members; many of which were also members of the Palomar Riders of Escondido. On May 6, 1947 we were officially incorporated as the Vista Riders with Bill Siburg as our first president. In 1948 the Palomar Riders of Escondido were winding down and approached the Vista Riders about giving their property in Harmony Grove (the old schoolhouse on Deer Spring in San Marcos) to the Vista Riders if we would change our name to The Vista Palomar Rider. June 27, 1948 the two clubs met at Harmony Grove for the consolidation to be completed and December 17, 1948 we filed a name change with the State.

The Harmony grove property was sold, and the proceeds used to develop the original Vista Palomar Riders grounds on Bobier and Santa Fe Avenue in Vista.



1930's Our roots go back to the Palomar Riders. The following information is taken from newspaper clipping from those early years:

Palomar Riders

It started out as a riding club originated by Mrs. Gracebel Harms in 1936, the club's President, meeting once a week in the morning and riding the entire day, each person carrying their own camping equipment. Other times 100-mile pack-in trips were made over the mountains or to the coast.


Each time this group got together they would have races, stock-horse showings, play games or drill in formation. At one of these meetings, a promoter happened by and suggested they put the drill on for his show. It proved to be such a success that the Del Mar Fair officials offered a contract, providing they could put on a full-length show, which they were able to do.

Ray Solemink of San Diego was employed to write the play, which was entitled "Early California Nights". It depicts the winning of the West. The prairie schooner, savage painted Indians on wild mustangs, handsome caballeros with their Thoroughbred horses and silver mounted outfits, miners, with their burros educated horses, and a host of rider, singers and musicians were all in the cast.

The show was acclaimed a tremendous success, besides an unusual epic of western history. Since then, it has been repeated many times in numerous cites up and down the coast.

The club now has an active membership or 30, and an honorary membership of 40, including the famous actor and horseman Leo Carrillo who is also honorary mayor of Vista, and official master of




ceremonies of Vista's annual Days of 49: Johnny Wagoner of Placentia, owner of California most beautiful palomino horse and matched black American bred saddle horses; Dave Willouby, of Rancho Santa Fe, who owns "Boulder Dam", the famous dancing horse; Bill Neary of Vista, owner of "Rex", the "Wonder Horse".


