- 1. Ballots can be mailed to PO Box 1145 Bonsall 92003 (must be received by 11/17/2021)
- 2. People can drop off ballots in person at clubhouse between 6:30pm and 7pm.
- 3. Ballots can be dropped off by other club members between 6:30pm and 7pm.

For 1 - Ballot needs to be completed. Ballot should be folded and put in an envelope. Seal the envelope. **Print and Sign** your name on the outside of the envelope. One Ballot per envelope if we have a family membership (two votes) each vote needs to be in a separate envelope. It is up to the voting member to timely mail the ballot. If the ballot is not received in the mail by Wednesday 11/17/2021 we cannot count your vote.

For 3 - Ballot needs to be completed. Ballot should be folded and put in an envelope. Seal the envelope. **Print and Sign** your name on the outside of the envelope. One Ballot per envelope if we have a family membership (two votes) each vote needs to be in a separate envelope.

Epona has been in our family for 20 years. This is difficult for me to do, but my circumstances have changed/are changing and I need to rehome her. Epona is in excellent health, no problems other than short-term reactions to bug bites. She does love barrel racing. I feel terrible about not being able to ride her very often now.

As anyone knows who has ridden with us, she is an excellent trail horse, willing to try anything, and good natured. Epona would love to get out at least once a week. I am looking for the right home, so am not in any particular hurry. I bought her for my daughter as a beginner horse when she was a teenager. Epona is 13.5 hands. (Short so not far to fall, lol).

Since she is 30, she has some particular needs. Epona needs room to walk around, so she can't be in a stall. She walks a lot. Also, since her teeth have stopped growing, she eats soaked food twice a day. I feed her a mix of alfalfa, timothy, and orchard pellets with Purina senior feed, and supplements daily. I give her CBD pellets to relieve stiffness in her joints, and a flake of orchard to make sure she has enough to eat between meals. Also, she uses a hackamore, as bits hurt her gums now.
