EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS by Tina Icorn

The VPR June/July newsletter mentioned writing your phone number on a horse's hoof if a horse must be left behind due to a wildfire. If the situation was so dire that I would have to turn a horse loose, I wouldn't want to risk getting kicked or trampled in the "heat of the moment" by a nervous or stressed horse. I personally don't keep markers handy nor keep hooves so clean they make a great writing surface. I really want to share what I use for a variety of situations.

As I travel alone, and quite often to venues where no one personally knows my horses or myself, I have been using Identification products from EquestriSafe for many years. I primarily use their Equine ID Collar (there are several styles) but for emergencies I also use their Fetlock ID Bands as well. Why? They are VERY visible, EASY to use, and it is EASY to change out information on the collars.

The Collars come with pockets that I can tuck my horse's name and my contact information inside. I can swap out the information for different horses, or different contact information. The Fetlock band has my phone number embroidered on it which is very easy to read. BOTH products can easily be put on a horse and in a matter of seconds (facing immediate evacuation every second counts) and stay in place with the strong Velcro. The bands have about a 32 lbs breakaway and the collars about 100 lbs breakaway. I have NEVER had one come off one of my horses, but I have no trouble removing them

when I am ready. We often see bunches of horses evacuated in an emergency – these products make it so easy to identify whose horse belongs to who.

These are many other great products! EquestriSafe is owned by Teresa, a horse person who designed these products for her own horses. She is happy to talk to you and answer any questions you may have. Fine customer service is a high priority for her. She ships orders quickly and if you encounter any issues, she's only a phone call away. I talked with her, and she has offered VPR members a discount!

When is the Election - Elections will be on 11/17/2021

- 1. Ballots can be mailed to PO Box 1145 Bonsall 92003 (must be received by 11/17/2021)
- 2. People can drop off ballots in person at clubhouse between 5:30pm and 7pm.
- 3. Ballots can be dropped off by other club members between 5:30pm and 7pm.

For 1 - Ballot needs to be completed. Ballot should be folded and put in an envelope. Seal the envelope. **Print and Sign** your name on the outside of the envelope. One Ballot per envelope if we have a family membership (two votes) each vote needs to be in a separate envelope. It is up to the voting member to timely mail the ballot. If the ballot is not received in the mail by Wednesday 11/17/2021 we cannot count your vote.

Epona has been in our family for 20 years. This is difficult for me to do, but my circumstances have changed/are changing and I need to rehome her. Epona is in excellent health, no problems other than short-term reactions to bug bites. She does love barrel racing. I feel terrible about not being able to ride her very often now.

As anyone knows who has ridden with us, she is an excellent trail horse, willing to try anything, and good natured. Epona would love to get out at least once a week. I am looking for the right home, so am not in any particular hurry. I bought her for my daughter as a beginner horse when she was a teenager. Epona is 13.5 hands. (Short so not far to fall, lol).

Since she is 30, she has some particular needs. Epona needs room to walk around, so she can't be in a stall. She walks a lot. Also, since her teeth have stopped growing, she eats soaked food twice a day. I feed her a mix of alfalfa, timothy, and orchard pellets with Purina senior feed, and supplements daily. I give her CBD pellets to relieve stiffness in her joints, and a flake of orchard to make sure she has enough to eat between meals. Also, she uses a hackamore, as bits hurt her gums now.
